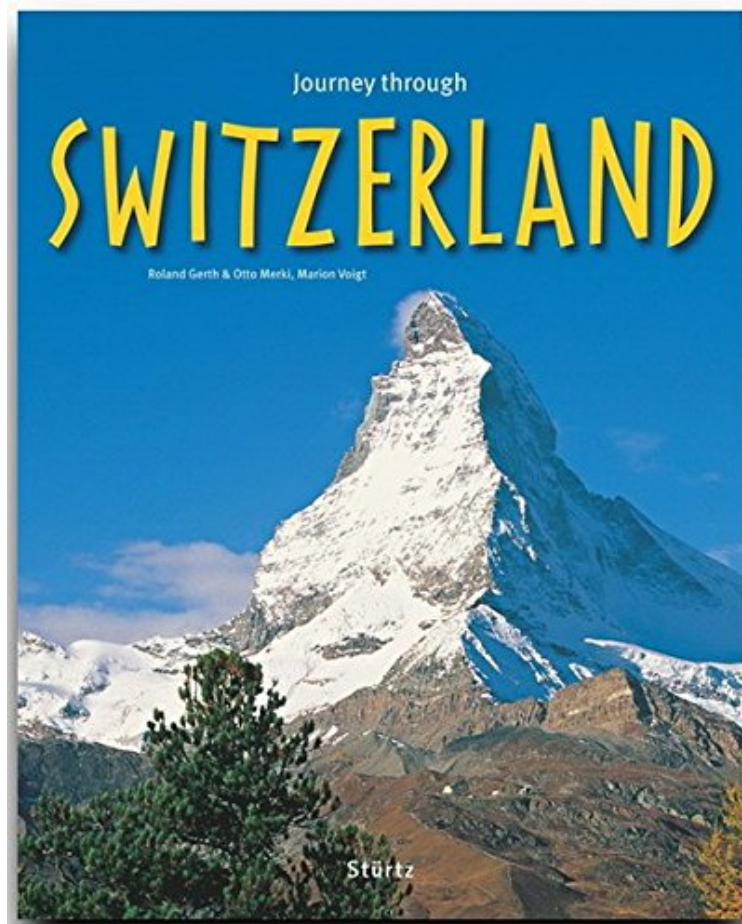

I debated which book to purchase. I examined both and found enough differences to buy both. If you are only going to purchase one, I'll try to give you some of the differences. Roland Gerth is the photographer for both. So some of the photos are the same but one book has the full page photo and the other may be part of several on one page. Stein-am-Rhein's oriel windows and fresco-painted houses are shown in Horizon, while Journey only shows the Rhine River front homes. Bern has a double page view of the cathedral and river plus 2 smaller pictures in Horizon. Journey has the same view but night time (1.5 page) with 3 smaller views (including one shared by both books). Journey shows both sides of the Gruyere street leading to the castle and the picture is a1.3 pages wide. Horizon shows a full page of one side of the street. St. Gallen has a 2

page spread of the Abbey library while Horizon shows it as 1.5 pages with 2 small town pictures. The majority of photos are not duplicates. Journey is the only book with 2 pictures of Morat (Murten). Only Horizon shows/discusses cheese. Horizon has more pages because it has a lot more text and the photos supplement that information. Journey has a little text in addition to the photo captions.
