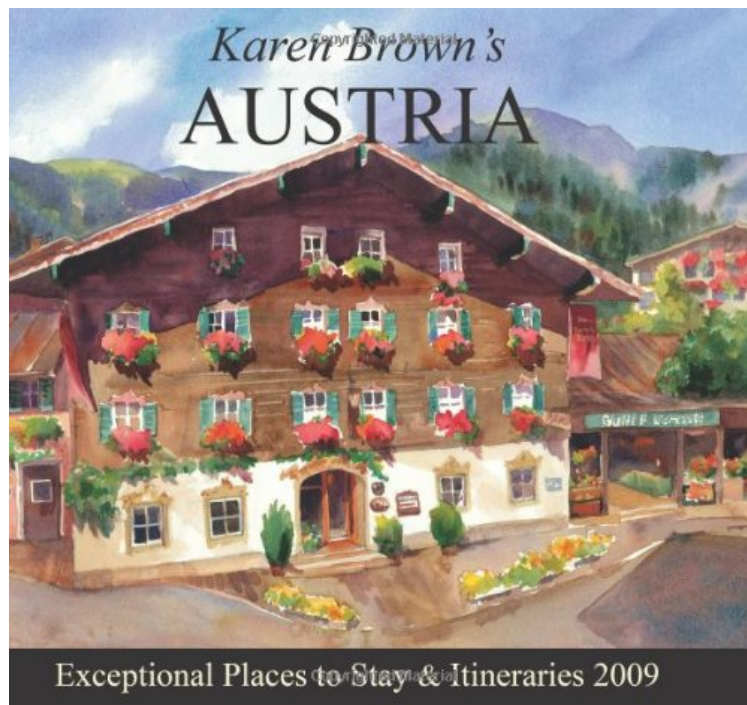

The touring advice is very sketchy, and probably only useful for the first-time visitor. The meat of the book is the hotel selections. There the selection tends toward the touristy places, inns with charm and atmosphere. That is OK, if that is what you are looking for. However, Austria is really full of such wonderful good places to spend a night or two. Hard to find a bad place, in my experience. So, there is no reason to think the few hotels described are really the very best places, but they could be. Even so, it appears as if hits are well selected, although it must be realized that most small inns are operated more from habit than for profit, and when "Opa" dies, the atmosphere may rapidly change.
