I lived in Rome for four months back in the fall of 2011 as a study abroad experience. This map was provided to me and my fellow American students by the education group we were studying with as a tool to help us navigate the city while we lived there. It quickly became my best friend. For starters, it's covered in a plastic coating like many maps, which keeps it from getting wet or wrinkled or soiled. It folds up perfectly to be placed in a purse or backpack, and I carried it with me everywhere. The street names are all on the map--all perfectly legible--and the map is very colorful. The major landmarks are pointed out with icons, but the best part about this map is the Metro lines--Rome has two, A and B--and this map lays them out in their proper colors of blue and orange, and shows you exactly which stops to take to get somewhere, and if you should change lines to get there. I can't tell you how many times I used this map in my first weeks in Rome because I wasn't sure where I was going. The map shows all of Rome--even where the old walls used to be, and out farther. One day, I had to go to the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls, and I was worried--would it even be on the map? It was outside the walls of the city, after all. But when I flipped open my map, I knew I shouldn't have worried--it was there, perfectly labeled, and I could easily follow the route I needed to take, and I knew that I should take the metro north, and then walk. The only drawback I found with this map was that Rome's bus lines were not included. THAT would have been a very helpful thing. The backside of the map has a close up view of the city center, along with interesting pieces of information about other sites. I would definitely recommend this map. In fact, my sister is going to Europe after she graduates as a graduation present, and will be visiting Rome for a couple of days. I knew I should get her something, and this was my first choice. When I go back to Rome, this is the first thing I'm taking with me.
