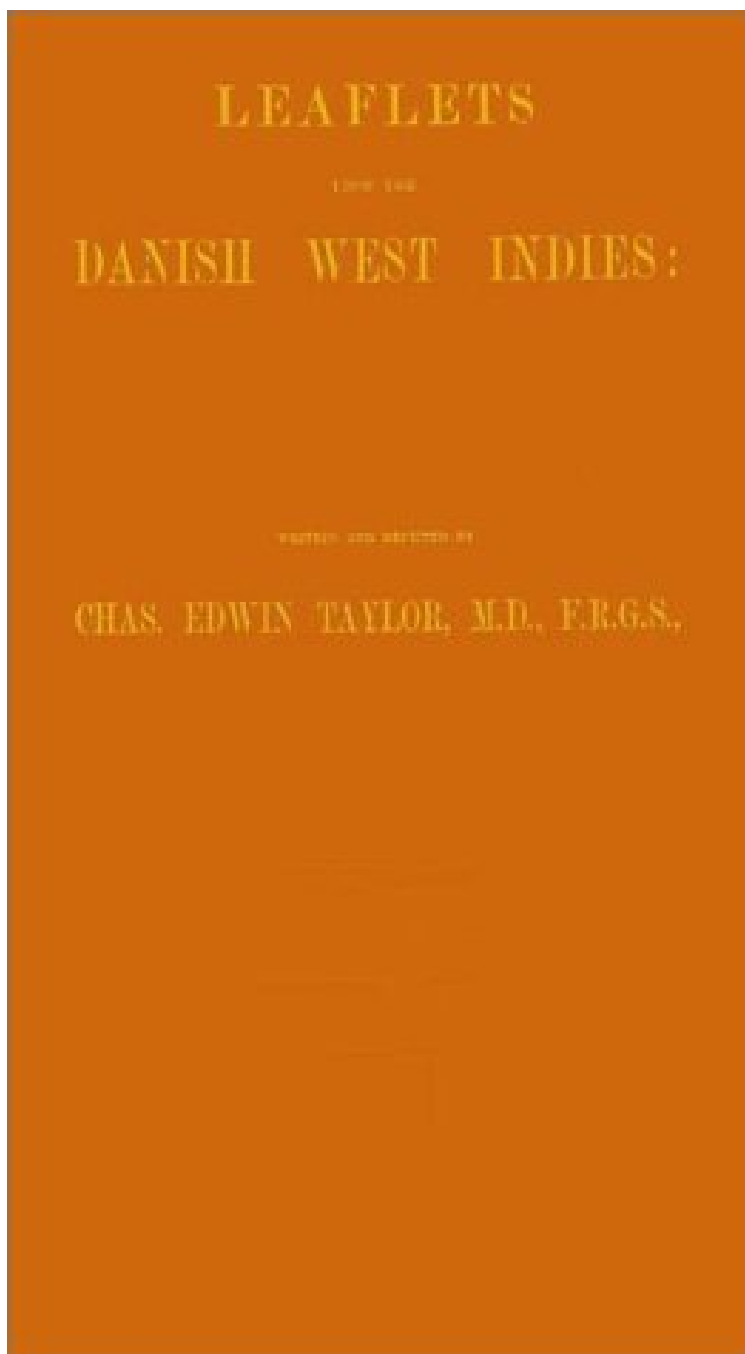

The author, Taylor, was a controversial figure in his time, both for his support (and practice) of homeopathic medicine and his being an 'outsider' to our culture. Upon reading this work, many years ago, and perusing the subscriptions (ads) for the many business included in the book, I found it suspicious that my great-grandfather's name and business were conspicuously absent. This leads me to believe that the two gentlemen may have had ideological differences, as my great-grandfather had lent his name and support of his business to the endeavors of many locally-born authors of the time (1888).
