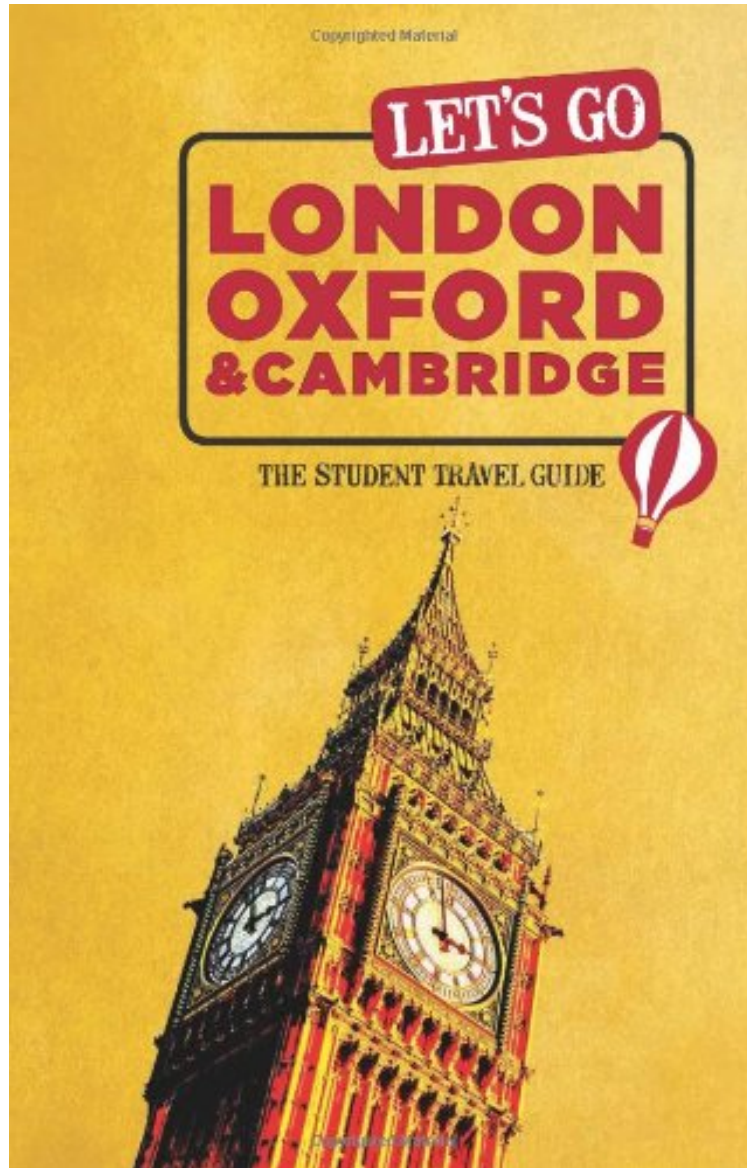


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## Let's Go London, Oxford Cambridge: The Student Travel Guide
