I browsed over it before my (first) trip to London, and enjoyed the writing style as well as content and organization. The shops are alphabetized within 10 categories (Artisan and Specialist Food Shops; Cafes, Coffee Shops and Tearooms; Cookery Classes; Gastropubs; etc). Then there are two indexes - one purely alphabetical, in case you had a shop in mind but couldn't remember in which category it was, as well as topics such as Indian food or Butchers. The other index was divided into area (Central, City of London, East, North, West, Southeast, Southwest) and the shops within each area were alphabetized, so if you were trying to plan a day in a particular part of town, you can look for the options nearby.I was staying with a college buddy who lives in London, and her two young adult children and she and her husband all enjoyed looking through it, finding places they hadn't heard of that they'd like to try, and finding confirmation of some of their favorite places. They agreed that it was pretty on-target. I had used a highlighter and written some notes, and encouraged them to write in it if they had recommendations. Then after I returned home, I ordered a copy to have delivered to their home by .co.uk for their use and future guests.My sister had not read it, and was on her own for a day while I had a business meeting, and she was delighted to find a lovely little teashop (Candella Tea Room) on her own. After her raving, I looked it up, and indeed, it was included in this book.

Essential reading for food lovers and includes where to buy the best produce and ingredients; how to prepare and cook

food; and expert advice and knowledge about coffee, tea and wine.
