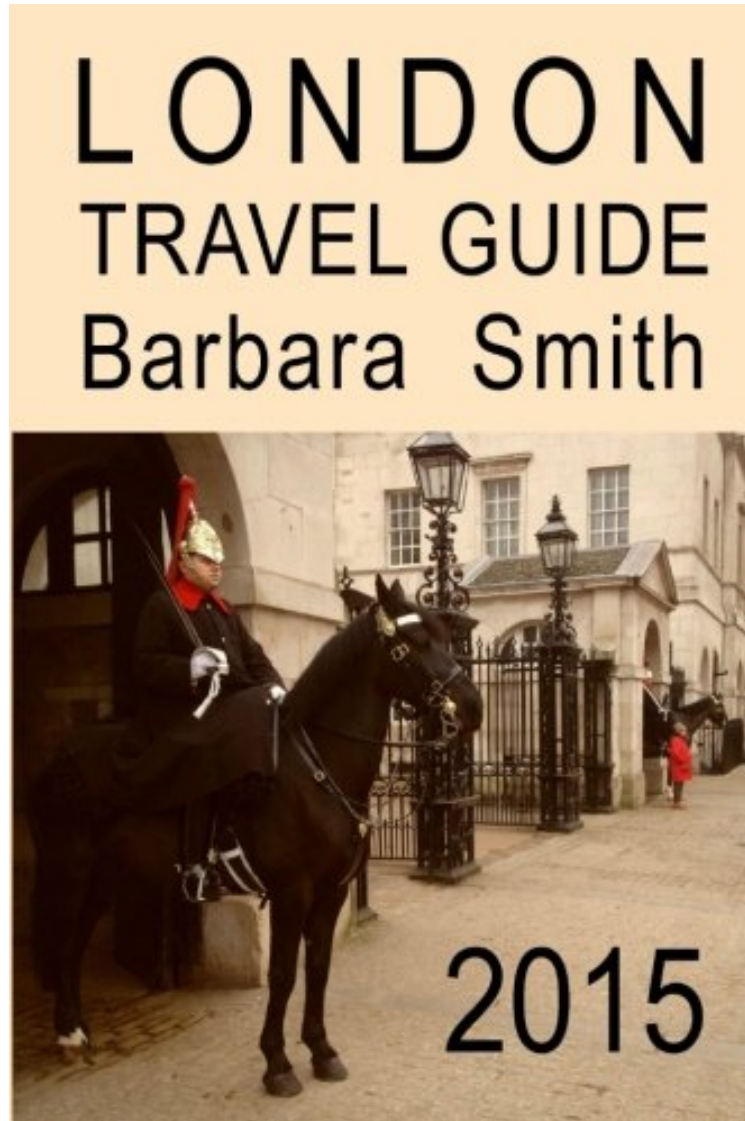

As far as where to eat, it features only 10 or so restaurants and pubs and places for tea, of which a few are quite pricey. Same

story for hotels (which concerns me less, since like most travelers I do my research online and I buy the book just to get around and find affordable places to eat). When I visit a country I want to have tips that go beyond the very obvious, and clear directions on a legible map on how to get there. The author offers readers to download maps she has online. Am I supposed to print out a dozen pages and pack them in the book to figure out my daily itinerary and areas where I want to wander? That's why I buy a book.
