version there is no index at all (it's been removed completely) and the very short contents section isn't at the beginning, so it's even hard to find the contents. When you do get to the contents, it's nowhere near as complete as the contents in the physical book or the pdf version. I don't have any particular issue with the content itself, it's just so hard to find what you want. And the maps are tricky to make good sense of when a single map is divided into four or six sections (each on a different Kindle page) to make them big enough to read. After spending quite a bit of time on the LP Kindle Austria Guide, I've just bought the pdf version of Vienna because it is so much easier to read (on a computer, not on a Kindle). It's a pity to have to buy part of the same book again in a different format.
