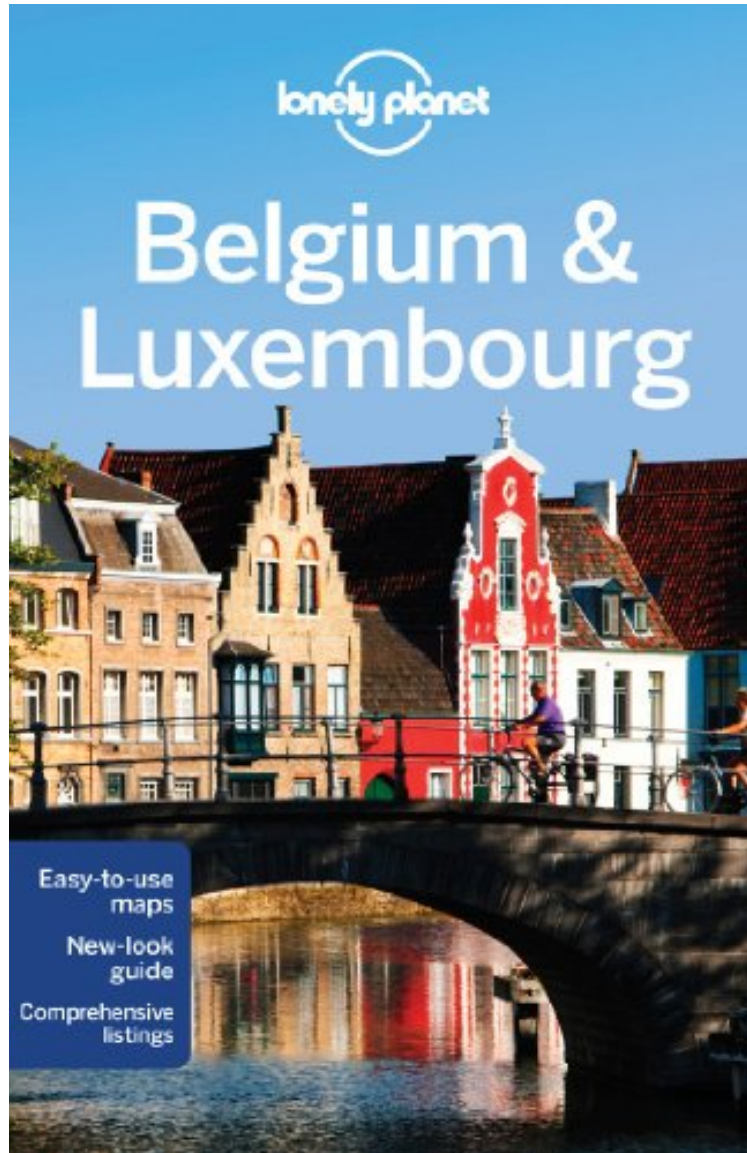

what you're after. And the maps. Really. I don't understand why the maps can't be easily accessible. I have a kindle because I don't want to carry printouts of maps and travel notes with me. I've used Lonely Planet PDFs on my kindle before, and they are much much better. Actual books are by far the easiest to navigate, but I'm trying to minimise what I carry with me. The information in the guide is good, if a bit outdated. We have been in Belgium for a month and have mostly done our traveling as tag-alongs with friends who are Flanders natives. They concurred with listings and highlights. The real let-down is that this book is very difficult to use as a kindle edition since it lacks any city listing or index in the table of contents.
