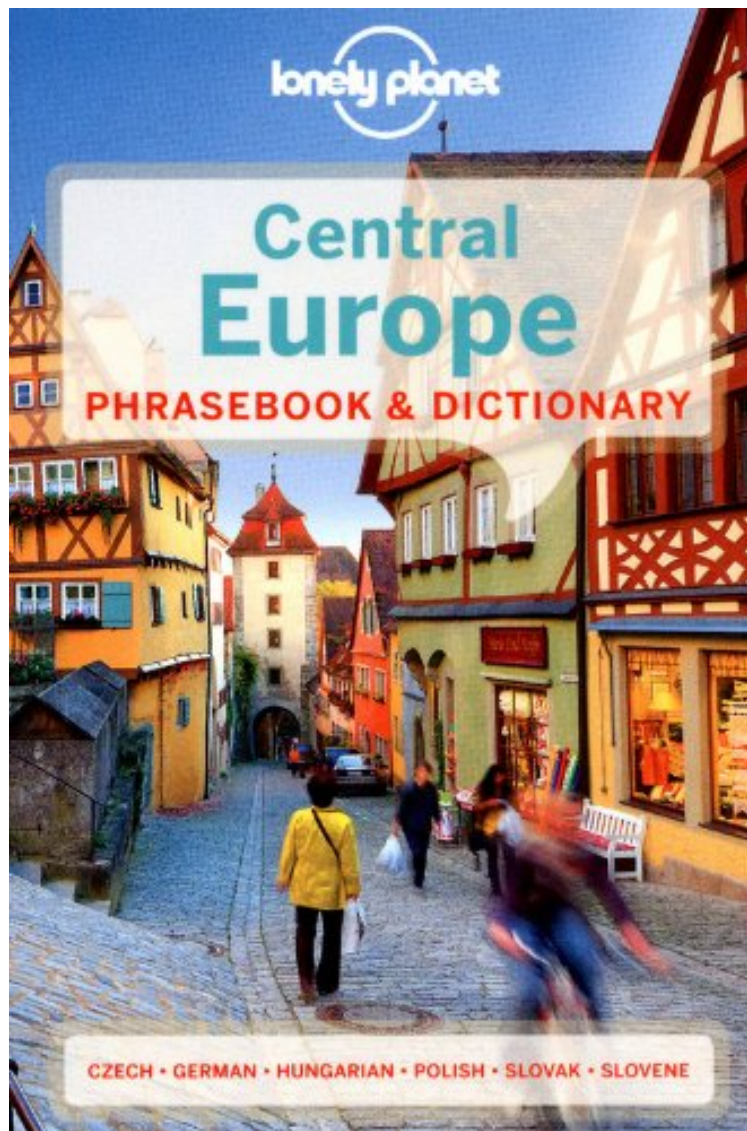

Pro's: This tiny phrasebook doesn't weigh much and doesn't take up much space. Con's: The usefulness of this phrasebook is equal to its size: very little. My eyesight is pretty good, I only need glasses to read--and only then for small type. The type in this book is TINY. Imagine yourself checking into a hotel.
