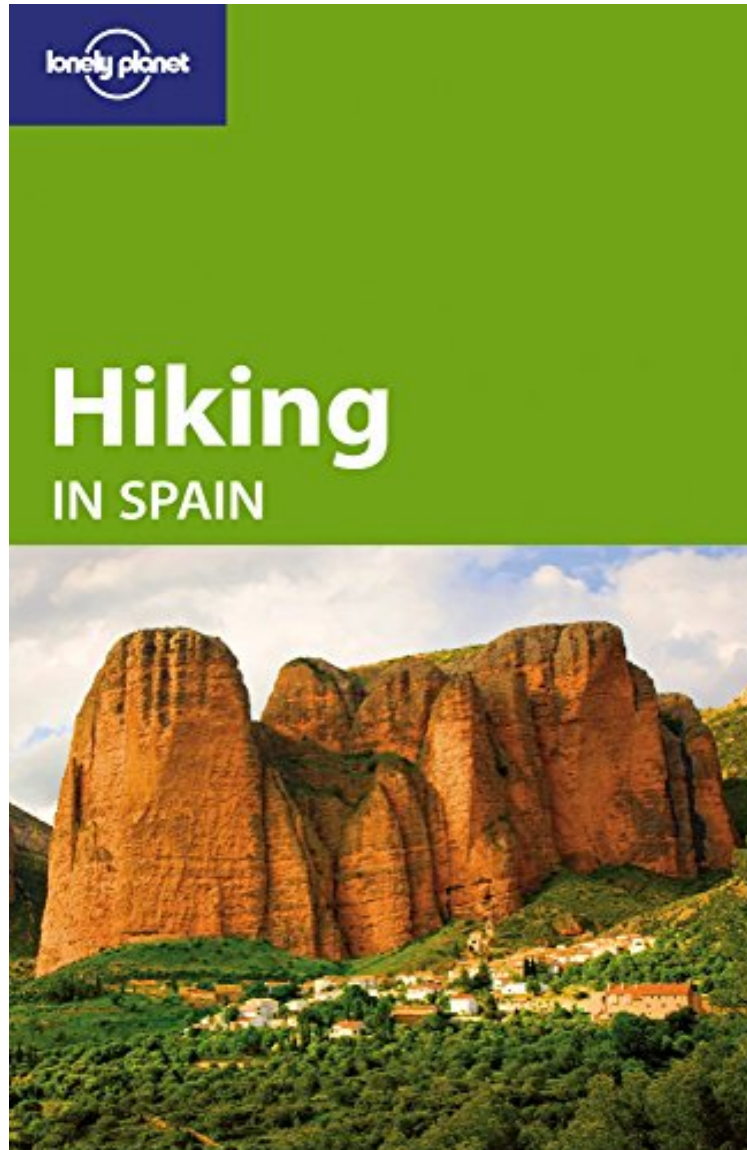

Luckily, the inn keeper informed us that the book had published the hike in reverse of the intended route, due to some sort of copyright issue.If we would have followed the book's instructions, we would have had a more difficult hike, and might have gotten lost. The inn

keeper said that many hikers have complained of getting lost after following this book, since all the arrows are pointing in the opposite direction, and the cairns aren't necessarily even visible from the route, if you follow the book. Once on the hike, we could see that he was correct. I found Lonely Planet's inclusion of this "backwards route" to be extremely unethical. But the book is the reason I even ended up on this beautiful hike, and it has a lot of good information. I don't know if there is a better guide available.
