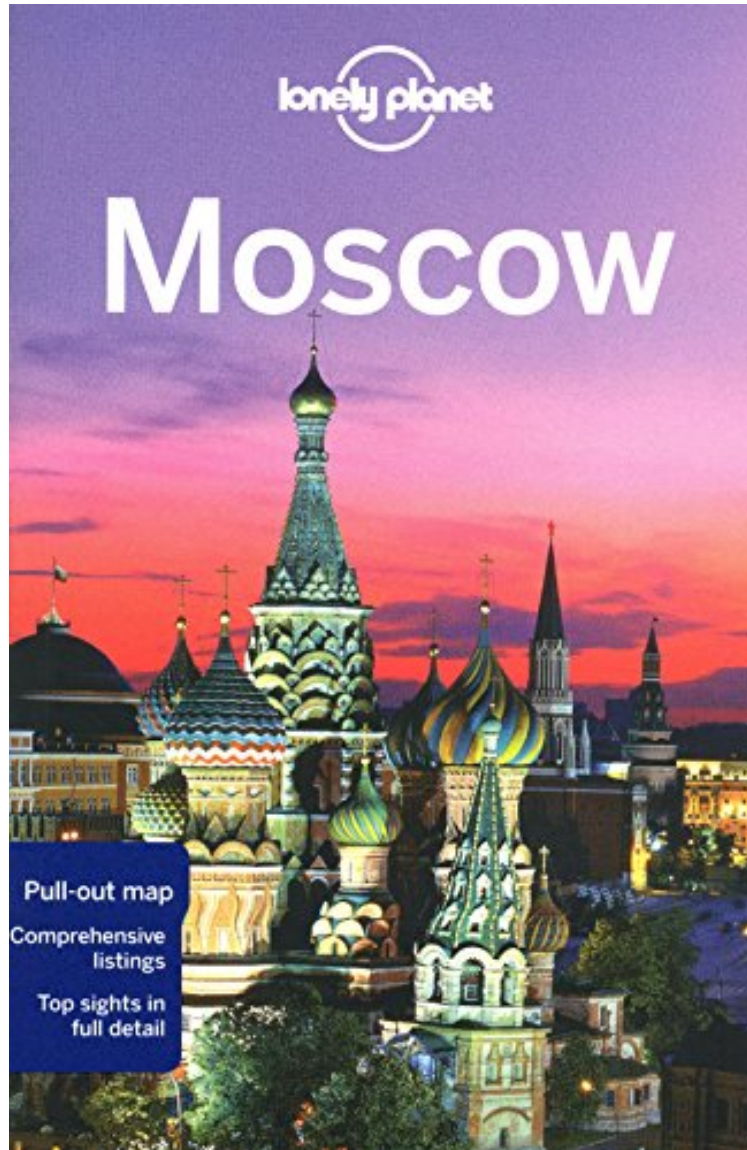

Not sure if I like the new layout of the books, but this one isn't too bad. Some of the info was fairly out of date, so I hope the author gets to visit Moscow again soon make some updates! In some cases the suggested metro stops are farther away than an alternate station, but

the closest metro stop would've been "off the map" in LP's small neighborhood maps. It appears they wanted to keep the maps scaled down. (suggest cross-checking the metro stations map with a larger map of Moscow so you can see which station is REALLY the closest)It's still a decent starting point for a Moscow guidebook, and proved useful enough during my two-month stay.0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
