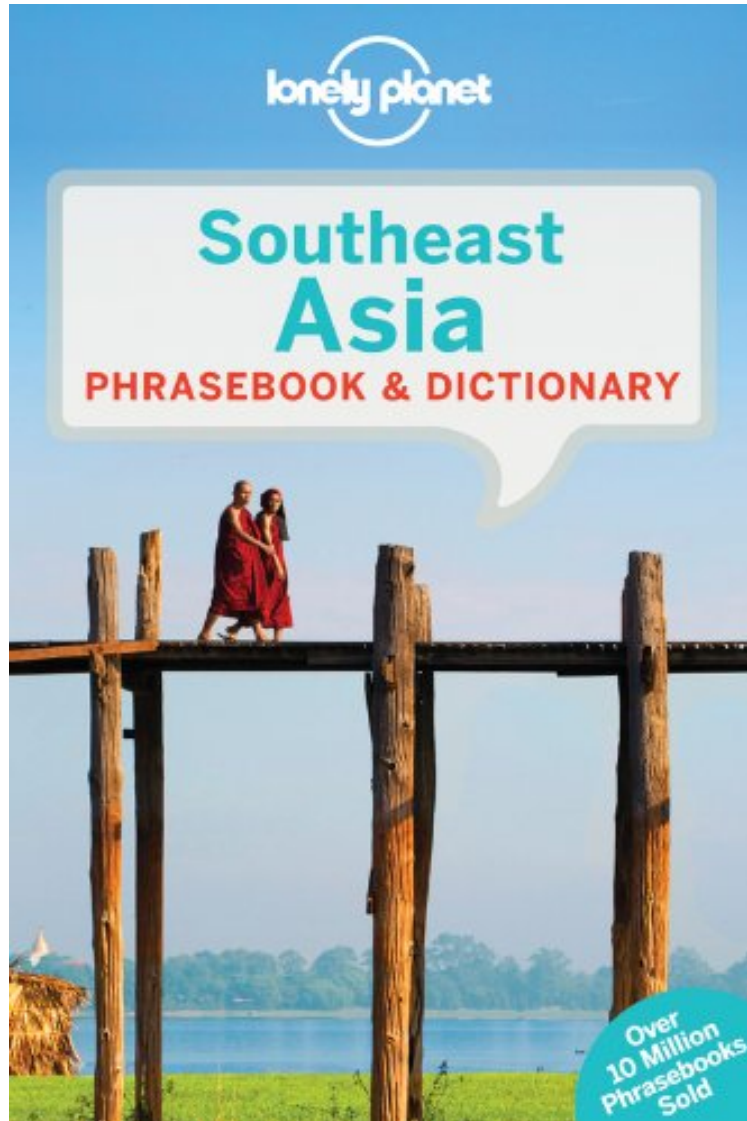

Vietnamese has relatively simple grammar but tonal usage is complex and you can end up saying something you didn't intend to say by use of the wrong

tonal inflection(s), Vietnamese is also the closest to Chinese mainly Cantonese.
