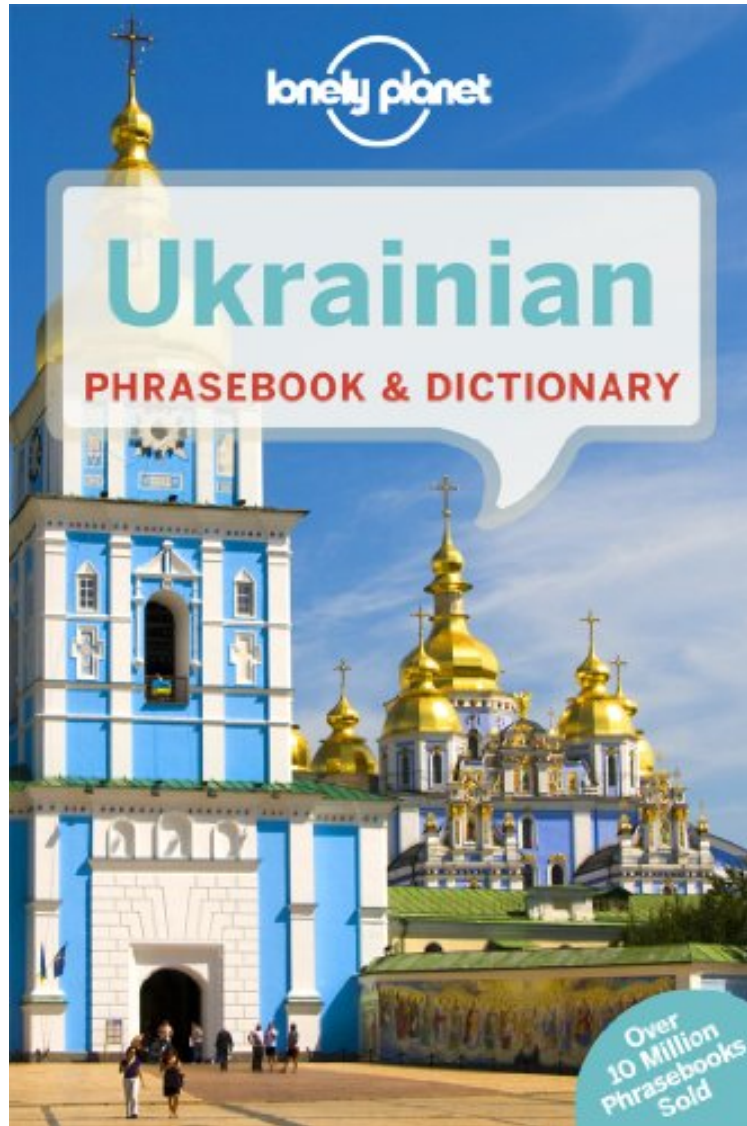

Will work in a pinch, kind of...By Zoe Wyatt Unfortunately, this isn't anything more than a reprint of the previous version of their Ukrainian phrasebook. Whereas most of Lonely Planet's new phrasebooks have a 3,500 word two way glossary, this phrasebook has around 2,000 words. Furthermore, like Russian, Ukrainian makes use of the perfective/imperfective distinction in their verbs. But unlike Lonely Planet's Russian phrasebook, verbs are not listed as being perfective or imperfective and the dictionary doesn't give both

variants. However, if you're going to Ukraine and don't mind getting by with less, if you're looking for something to supplement your Ukrainian studies (and let's face it, there isn't a lot out there), or if you want something to check that Ukrainian produced Ukrainian-English dictionary definition against (for when your dictionary says 'excitement' in English when it really means 'arousal'), then this will help somewhat.
