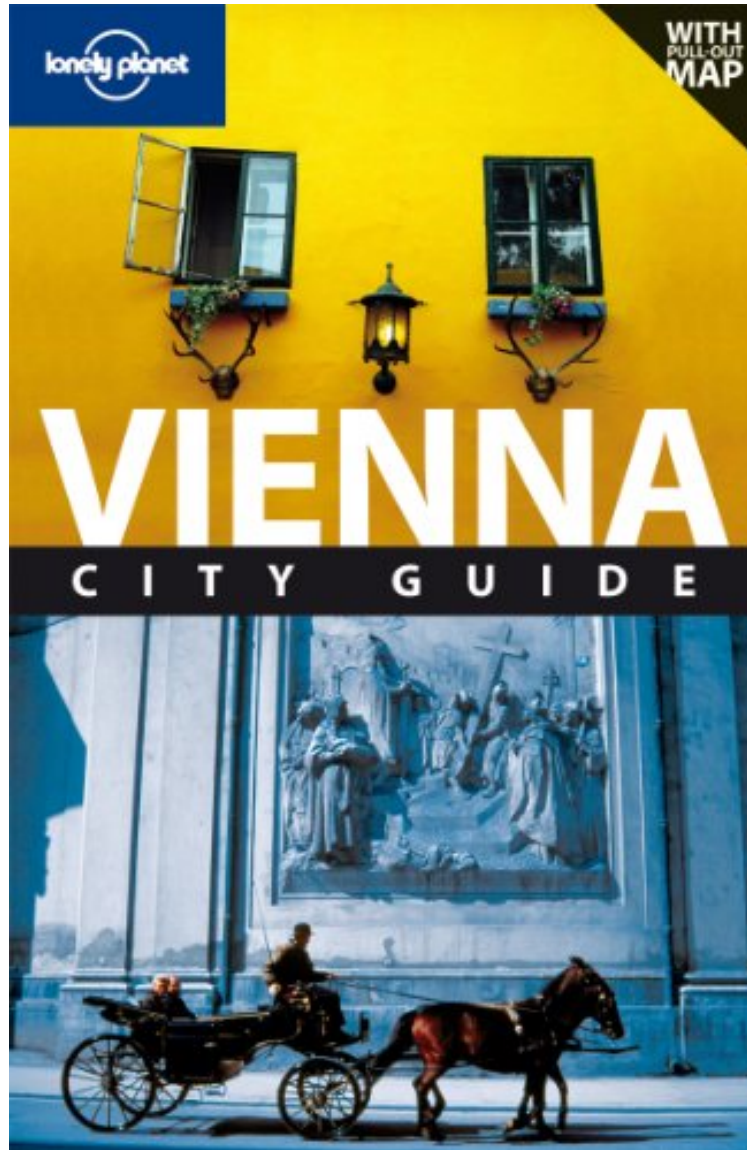

The text is printed in an incredibly small font. I purchased this book without seeing it first based on experience with past Lonely Planet books. Never again. Outside of some interesting history and information on the Third Man movie, I found little useful about this city guide. I was much better served

with a map provided by the hotel and by chatting with the hotel concierge or club floor staff (at a hotel that is not mentioned in the LP guide). This city guide seems to devote all their effort to directing travel on the cheap, rather than evaluating what is there and letting you decide for what you might want to pay more. The guide's format seemed to jump around, which became distracting. All in all, a Frommer's is the way to go, LP just doesn't work for me any more. 2 of 2 people found the following review helpful. There's lots of great history and culture, and although far from perfect, you'll do a lot worse with other imprints in my experience. Very helpful on a recent trip. Found book to be really useful to pack in as much as possible during a brief 2.5 day visit. Pull out map particularly useful. Felt coffee shops are over rated in the book with poor service, crowded even though we were out of season (early March), and not particularly good coffee. No need to go to the ones mentioned in the book as others offer similar or better quality and less crowded. Chocolatiers are also over rated and over priced. Visit Belgium instead. Museums/art galleries are essential and excellent, as is the purchase of standing tickets for the opera. Available at 6:30pm on day of performance. Don't expect to be comfortable but location is great and only 3 euros. The description of the Sunday mass with Vienna Philharmonic and Boys Choir makes it a must see and strongly recommend.
