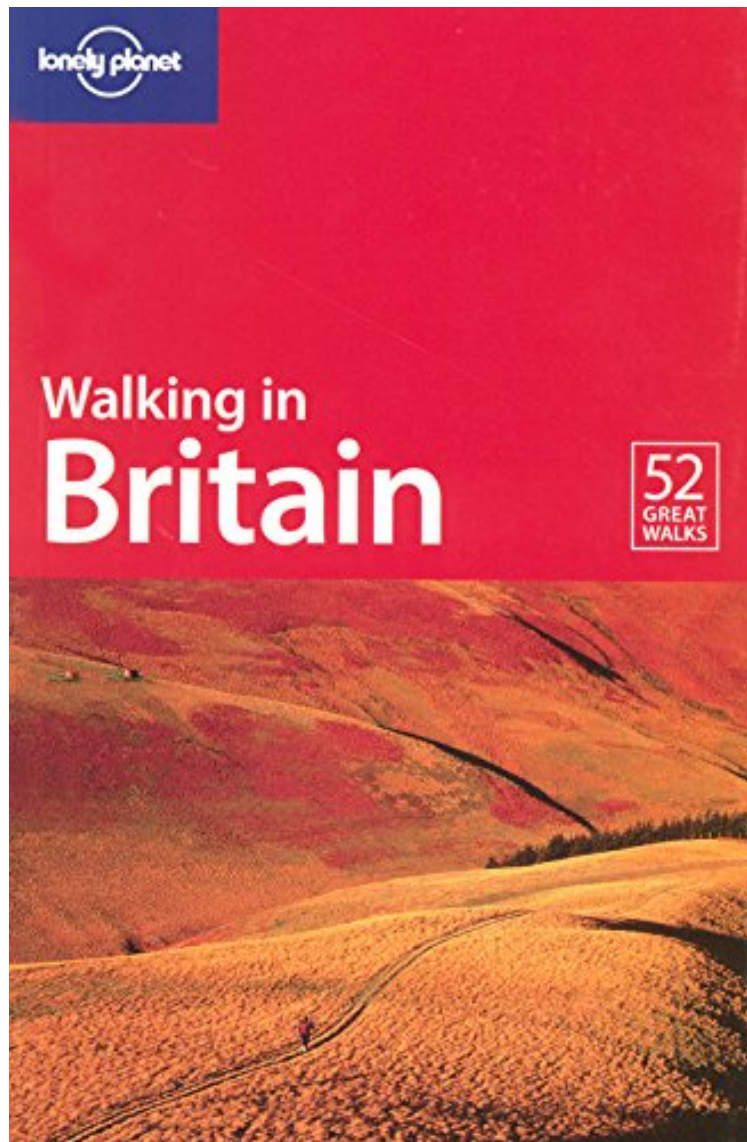

If you're planning one of the multi-day long-distance walks, you probably want something with more coverage than this book, but it's a great resource for deciding which long distance walk you might want to tackle. In June I did a bit of the Cotswold Way and the Pembrokeshire Coast Path.
